On my first visit, children were queuing up to leave the playground 10 minutes before the end of playtime, and the school used very little of the available space. As a result, playtimes were noisy, crowded and boring for the majority of children.

The school has successfully implemented many of the cultural and practical changes recommended in the OPAL programme, and the results are clear to see. Race Leys is now truly an OPAL school.
